Individualized instruction, where students have the ability to progress at their own rate, with lessons often presented in small groups.


Multi-age classrooms (grades 1-3 and 4-5) which encourage students to teach and learn from each other.

Alliance Charter Elementary is a public charter school in the Neenah Joint School District, utilizing an Active, Individualized, and Enriching Montessori Approach.

What is a charter school?

Charter schools are public, nonsectarian schools created through a contract or “charter” with the sponsoring school board. These schools are active components of their school districts.

Alliance is an instrumentality of the Neenah Joint School District. Our school was founded in 2004, through an agreement with the Neenah School District. Alliance offers families a choice in public elementary education.

As a charter school, Alliance is also freed from many state regulations regarding public education. Yet, we are held accountable for student learning outcomes. Alliance students are required to complete standard performance testing such as the Forward Exam.

To attend, families must specifically request the charter school. Kindergarten students should be registered at their home school and should specify Alliance as their school of choice on the registration form.

Alliance is a public school. No tuition is charged.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I enroll my child in Alliance?

Families must choose Alliance, either by applying or by selecting Alliance as their preferred choice when registering for kindergarten and completing a Boundary Exemption form. A deadline for application is set each year, usually in February.

Students will be placed using a lottery system; a waiting list will be kept as needed. Students from other districts need to complete an open enrollment form. To obtain a copy of the open enrollment form and/or verify the application deadlines, please contact the Neenah Joint School District office at 751-6800.

Where is Alliance located?

Within Roosevelt Elementary School:
215 East Forest Avenue, in Neenah.

Who are the Teachers?

Alliance teachers are employed by the NJSD, and all have Montessori teacher training as required by the Charter.

How many students does Alliance have?

About 125 students are enrolled at Alliance.

What are the school hours?

Classroom hours differ from other elementary schools in Neenah. They are:
Monday-Thursday 8:00 AM – 3:05 PM
Friday: 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM
